Coonamble, Gulargambone & Quambone

Why not take the loop route off the Newell and visit the inspiring little village of Gulargambone and the town of Coonamble before rejoining the highway? See the corrugated iron 'galahs' on the side of the road as you approach Gulargambone and find out why this village has won numerous awards. Visit the 'two eight two eight' café and gallery, a community tourism project that was won the 2006 Australian Tourism Awards in the 'General Tourism Services' category. Or visit the tiny village of Quambone, gateway to the Macquarie Marshes.

Then continue on to Coonamble, service centre to the west and host of the largest combined Rodeo and Campdraft in the Southern hemisphere held each June Long Weekend. The unique Castlereagh River runs through the district – a river that runs beneath the sand, and when in flood is one of the fastest in the country. Coonamble is central to a range of tourist destinations

including day trip to the Lightning Ridge opal fields in the north and the Pilliga State Forest with its stands of eucalypts and salt caves, For rustic charm, warm hospitality and icy cold beer, be sure to experience one of the country pubs that the Coonamble Shire houses – whether it be one of the four in town or any of those in the outlying villages of Quambone, Gulargambone, Come By Chance, Tooraweenah, Baradine, Pilliga or Carinda.
