Stop, revive, survive. Strategically located on the Newell, Jerilderie is just over a 3¹/₂ hour drive from Melbourne and is a great place to break your journey or make a base for day trips to Deniliquin, Griffith and Tocumwal ; the town also forms the southern gateway to the Kidman Way Outback Experience.

Attractions

Jerilderie has a host of attractions, all situated within easy walking distance of the Visitor Information Centre which is situated right in the heart of our heritage precinct in Powell Street with ample caravan and visitor parking nearby.

Jerilderie was the only town in NSW visited by Ned Kelly and his gang in 1879. Start our National Heritage Raid Trail at The Ned Kelly Post and Telegraph Office - Walk in Ned's footsteps, explore the 16 sites and make your own decision – Ned Kelly hero or outlaw?

Enjoy the eclectic mix of shops, award winning historic homes and galleries such as local artist Sos Hawkins of Simply Ceramics and Jerilderie Arts. Take a tour of Ye Olde Bank of NSW, Ned Kelly Blacksmith shop and The Doll Museum. Take time out at the Jerilderie Bakery or any one of our cafes and eateries, all right in the heart of town.

Be amazed at the "Steelwings" in Luke Park, an enormous windmill made in the 1900's -one of only two of its kind in the world or enjoy the quiet surrounds of Horgan's Walk, the 1.8 km walking track alongside the Billabong Creek.
